#### \*About French Class

The purpose of Randolph Middle School's French classes is to introduce students to the French language and culture. As students progress from 6th through 8th grade their skills will develop from rudimentary words and phrases in 6th grade to simple sentence construction in 7<sup>th</sup> grade, to advanced sentence construction in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. This will eventually allow the students to:

- Use French to engage in person-to-person communication.
- 2. Understand words and concepts presented in the French language.
- 3. Use the language to present information to an audience.
- 4. Compare the students' culture and the target culture.

The three courses are designed to facilitate smooth transitions from one class to the next, building on the concepts already learned. In all three classes, students will practice their language skills through the four key areas of language learning: reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

#### \*A Note About 8th Grade French

In this course, students will be taking high school level French 1. After successful completion of this year-long course, students will be able to enter into French 2 as a high schooler. In June, students will take a state-mandated EOC that will count as 25% of their overall course average, and will test them in reading, writing, listening, and speaking.
